## **Trinity Young - \$1000 Scholarship Recipient**



With the increasing demand for interior fit-out and renovation projects, the construction industry has seen an upsurge in hazards associated with above ceiling work. With sharp objects, live electrical wiring, and hot steam/water, it is essential to assess your environment and identify specific hazards prior to working above ceiling.

# **Major Risks When Working Above Ceiling:**

#### **Electrical Shock**

- Exposed live electrical conductor/wiring
- Electrical connections where the condition of wiring has deteriorated
- Unused wiring left in the ceiling that could be still connected to the switchboard
- Past electrical work not performed by competent person

### **Sharp Objects & Impalement Hazards**

- Access door configurations
- Metal ceiling studs, supports, or grid
- Exposed grid wire or grid hooks
- Treaded rods or pipe supports

## **Active Mechanical & Plumbing Utilities**

- Uninsulated hot water or steam pipes
- Active sprinkler systems when performing hot work

## **Hazard Mitigation:**


#### **Eliminate:**

- De-energize any live electrical circuits prior to performing work above ceiling.
  - Schedule work to be preformed during off-hours to ensure systems can be shut down.
  - Examine all relevant plans prior to work and determine which circuit(s) need to be de-energized.
  - Test the circuit breaker with a multimeter to confirm system is shut down.

#### **Substitute:**

- Using c-track as access door supports instead of an angle
  - Access door assemblies can vary depending on the manufacturer's specifications.
     The design of the support system should ensure no risk of laceration when preforming maintenance.





#### **Engineering Control:**

- Identify & protect sharp edges prior to performing work.
  - Use foam like material to create an edge trim to protect any sharp edges.

#### **Administrative Control:**

• Require completion of "Above Ceiling Checklist" in order to identify hazards and document hazards prior to work.

## **Personal Protective Equipment:**

- Kevlar sleeves cut resistant gloves when working around or with sharp metal materials
- Insulated tools, and insulated gloves, and insulated working mat
